STM SERVES

This art installation was funded by **Dr. and Mrs. John Vigorito**, honoring the final wishes of **Ms. Rita McGrath** and **Ms. Lorraine Marchand**, former Most Holy Sacrament sisters who taught and served at St. Thomas More from 1982 to 2005. Both loved books, libraries and art - and were committed to education and service.

The 2015-2016 Art IV Honors class brainstormed possible ideas for a library art piece and decided on a technique that would allow every student at St. Thomas More to contribute to the final product. These art students stained 49 12"x12" wooden canvases in four different solid colors representing the four grade levels. The project was completed through religion classes so that each student could take part in the creation of the mural.

Art teacher Kimberly Thibodeaux and religion teacher Shannon Phillips collaborated to choose the main theme of service and to select a different Bible verse for each religion teacher. With art students available for help, the 49 religion classes were responsible for painting a large symbol (pattern or design) on a designated canvas. The paintings represent how each religion class chose to illustrate the assigned Bible verse. The students in these classes also wrote a sentence about how they contribute to the service of others. Their writing was printed and glued on the edges of each class panel.

Scott Johnstone's advanced theatre classes then mounted the canvases in rows on wooden backing so that the project could be hung. Final installation was completed April 12, 2016, by Casey Friend and Kimberly Thibodeaux.
